Re: Request for Extension of Groveland PUD – December 19, 2023 City Council Mtg

Please find attached a request from Dennis R. White, (owner) for a time extension to the approved Preliminary Plat (PUD) for Groveland PUD Subdivision. I recommend this item be placed on the December 13, 2023 City Council meeting for review by the City Council. It does <u>not</u> require a public hearing but should receive a formal motion to either approve or deny.

The applicant, KB Homes Idaho LLC, received the Special Use Permit, PUD, and Preliminary Plat approval on November 18, 2022. This is a PUD subdivision, which allows construction to begin within 2 years of written approval, and up to 5 years to record the final plat. The subdivision ordinance gives 18 months to record a final plat or ask for a time extension. Because this is a PUD subdivision, staff's interpretation of the code is we will follow the PUD ordinance.

KB Homes LLC has abandoned this project and the land owner, Dennis R. White and Willean White have requested a time extension of the preliminary plat. Staff is in support of this time extension for 1 year from the date of the written decision. The ordinance does not specify conditions under which an approval is granted or not. So, it is my interpretation that the City Council may grant the time extension based on any reasonable reason for the delay

Sec. 9-9-13.-Expiration and extension of approval period.

The approval of a development plan for a PUD shall be for a period not to exceed five years to allow for preparation and recording of the required subdivision plat and the development of the project. If no construction has begun within two years after approval is granted, the approved development plan shall be void. An extension of the time limit or modification of the approved development plan may be approved if the city finds that such extension or modification is not in conflict with the public interest.

Possible motion:

I recommend approval of a one-year time extension to start construction of Groveland PUD Subdivision PUD with an option to file another extension upon showing good cause. Construction must start two years from the written date of approval, which will be November 18, 2024.

1. APPLICATION SUMMARY

The applicant, Kent Brown, is requesting approval of a Final Plat application for Skyhawk Subdivision. The subdivision includes 28 single-family residential lots, 15 multi-family lots, and 5 common lots. The required improvements have been installed and reviewed by City Staff. The landscaping will not be completed by the council meeting, and the owner is requested acceptance of a letter of credit to guarantee the landscaping is completed.

The subdivision is located on the south side of W. 4th Street and east of S. Mill Road. The preliminary plat was approved by the City Council on 4/27/2021, with requested extensions of time to file a final plat approved by council.

Emmett City Code (ECC) 10-2-4 outlines the procedures for final plat approval. Sub-section 'F' notes that prior to approving or disapproving a plat, "at least one public meeting (deliberation) shall be held by the city council." No public hearing is required for final plat applications and no notice was given (other than posting the meeting agenda). Sub-section 'G' notes that the council may delay their decision pending submission of additional information or approve, or disapprove the final plat application as presented.

The applicant is requesting a letter of credit in the amount of \$224,136.00 for the following improvement:

1. Completion of landscaping.

<u>Staff Recommendation</u>: Staff recommends approval of the final plat application for Skyhawk with the site-specific conditions of approval being part of the motion.

2. APPLICATION & PROPERTY FACTS

A. Site Address/Location:

The site is located on the south side of W. 4th Street and east of S. Mill Rd., in Township 06N, Range 01W, Section 7.

B. Current Owner(s): Challenger Development

C. Applicant(s): Kent Brown

D. Representative: John Laude Jr. and David Wilde, Trilogy Development

E. Present Zoning: R-1, single-family residential and R-3, multi-family

3. APPLICATION PROCESS FACTS

A. Application Submittal:

The application for this item was received by the Zoning Department on May 10, 2022.

B. Relevant Ordinances and Required Actions:

The subject application will in fact constitute a Final Plat application, as determined by Emmett City Code 10-4. The City Council must review and make a decision to either grant, grant with conditions, or deny the application.

4. SITE SPECIFIC CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

- 1. The petitioner to supply the city a set of as-built plans on Mylar as well as on CD -Rom or disc in AutoCAD format and PDF format.
- 2. Completed, signed and recorded Declaration of Covenants, Conditions, and Restrictions (CC & R's) of Skyhawk Subdivision.
- 3. Post a bond for 150% of the estimated completion of the landscape improvements. The amount of the bond is \$224,136.00 with work completed by June 19, 2024.
- 4. Final plat must be recorded within 1 year of written approval unless an extension is requested and granted by the City.
- 5. The applicant is to follow all recording requirements as outlined in ECC 10-2-4K.

I. RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into a Memorandum of Understanding for Cooperative Maintenance of Public Rights-of-Way City of Emmett and Gem County ("MOU") in April 2015; and

WHEREAS, the MOU outlines the parties respective obligations with regard to City Utilities: "Any City-owned sewer, water, or stormwater infrastructure placed within a County right-of-way shall have a utility easement created and recorded at the Gem County Clerk's Office. Said easement shall, at a minimum, include a legal description, financial responsibilities, and rights of access and maintenance,"; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to extend its infrastructure thru the County's right-of-way and the City needs to ensure access for its employees, vehicles, and equipment for installation, operation and maintenance of Grantee Owned water & sewer utility pipelines, manholes, sewer lift stations, access roadways, fiber conduit, related infrastructure, and other equipment and structures ("Utility Facilities"); and

WHEREAS, the servient right of way is owned by County; and

WHEREAS, Grantor, covenants and warrants that it is the owner in fee simple or has legal access to certain real property located on a portion of roadway in Gem County, Idaho, commonly known as Substation Road from Highway 16 to 12th Street, and more particularly described in Exhibit A and generally depicted on Exhibit B, both of which are attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference (the "Easement"): and

WHEREAS, Grantor acknowledges that it is fully authorized to execute this Easement Agreement and forever bind themselves, their successors and assigns and the subject Easement property to the terms set forth herein; and

WHEREAS, Grantor desires to convey this easement to the Grantee solely for the purposes described herein; and

NOW, THEREFORE, in return for good and valuable consideration, including agreements set forth herein, the receipt and sufficiency of such consideration being hereby acknowledged, the Grantor does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and transfer said Easement to Grantee as outlined below:

II. Agreement

- A. <u>Recitals Incorporated.</u> The above Recitals are incorporated into this Easement Agreement.
- B. <u>Grant of Easement.</u> Grantor does hereby grant, bargain, sell, convey and transfer unto Grantee, and its successors and assigns, this permanent Easement and Right-of-way, as set forth in the legal description attached hereto and incorporated herein as "Exhibit A," for the purpose of locating, establishing, constructing, maintaining, repairing and operating underground Utility Facilities. It is expressly understood and agreed that the term, covenants, and conditions of this Easement shall be and constitute a covenant running with the land and binding upon, and shall constitute an obligation on Grantor, its successors and assigns.
- C. <u>Construction and Maintenance Rights.</u> The Easement also contains the right to excavate and refill ditches and trenches for the location of said Utility Facilities, the right to remove bushes, trees, undergrowth and other obstructions interfering with the location, construction, and maintenance of said Utility Facilities.
- D. <u>Financial Responsibilities</u>. The Grantee, on behalf of itself, and its successors and assigns, shall install or allow to be installed and maintain, at Grantee's sole cost and expense, all Utility Facilities located in the Easement in good and sufficient repair.
- E. <u>Right of Ingress and Egress</u>. This Easement Agreement expressly conveys to Grantee the right of ingress and egress in, from, to, over and across the adjacent real property owned or controlled by Grantor and the Easement for the purpose of exercising and enjoying the rights granted herein, including but not limited to, inspecting, maintaining and repairing such Utility Facilities.
- F. <u>Right of Way Permit Required.</u> Prior to any work being performed under this agreement, the Grantee or its successors and assigns, is required to apply for and receive a right of way permit from Gem County Road and Bridge. Notwithstanding the foregoing, if an emergency exists that requires Grantee to work in the easement (e.g., failure of the Utility Facilities) prior to receiving a right of way permit, then Grantee shall apply for and receive a right of way permit as soon as reasonably practical.

- G. <u>Rights Reserved</u>. Grantor hereby conveys said Easement, rights, and rights-of-way to Grantee, its successors and assigns in perpetuity, except that Grantor reserves the right to occupy, use, and cultivate the surface of said Easement for all purposes not inconsistent with the rights herein granted. Notwithstanding, Grantor shall not interfere with Grantee's use, access, or repair of said Easement. No building, tree or other permanent structure shall be constructed or otherwise placed in the area of or on top of Easement. Likewise, nothing shall be placed on the Easement by Grantor which would restrict or inhibit vehicular as to the Easement such as fences, gates, or barriers. In the event Grantor performs any construction, excavation or other improvements on the surface of said Easement, the Grantor will perform due diligence in protecting the Easement and Utility Facilities within the Easement.




